NOW THEREFORE the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Parties shall contribute to exchange information on community engagement programmes and train the students on Community engagement.
- 2. Pravara Rural College of Pharmacy shall bear the expenditure towards training expenses and any other expense arising during the duration of the course upon mutual consent between the two organizations.
- 3. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (A Deemed to be University) shall provide the necessary infrastructure (Laboratory, Classrooms, Seminar Hall) sought for the smooth functioning of the training subject to availability. In the event of some course selected which may be run at any other sister concern; the parties shall mutually decide and then come to a consensus.
