

These meters are supplied by MSEDCL. The monthly electricity bill is served by MSEDCL based on the electricity used and is paid by the college. The cost of power is calculated by summing up the total kilowatt-hours (KWH) of all connections and their amounts over the year 2022-2023.

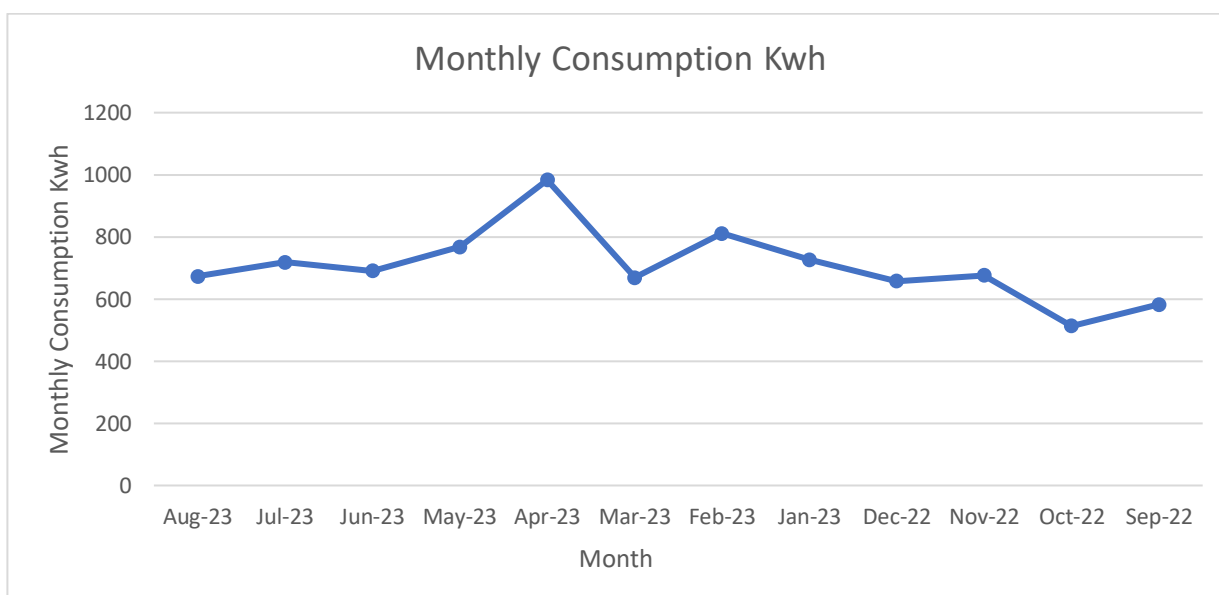

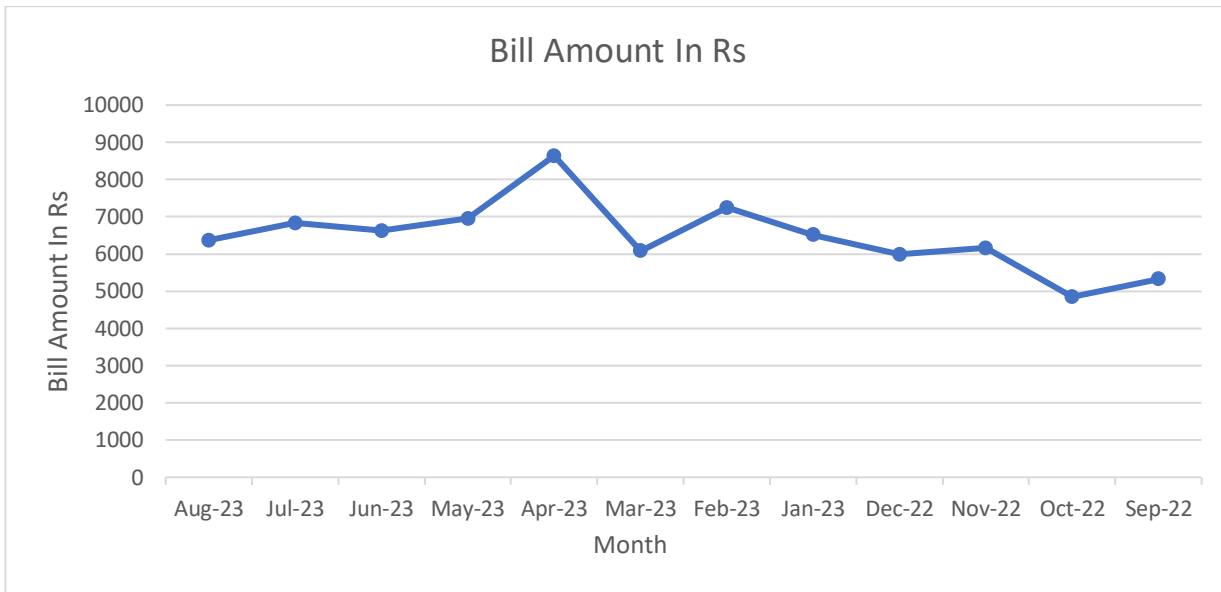

7 Green Audit

Green audit was initiated with the beginning of 1970s with the motive of inspecting the work conducted within the organizations whose exercises can cause risk to the health of inhabitants and the environment. It exposes the authenticity of the proclamations made by multinational companies, armies and national governments with the concern of health issues as the consequences of environmental pollution. It is the duty of organizations to carry out the Green Audits of their ongoing processes for various reasons such as; to make sure whether they are performing in accordance with relevant rules and regulations, to improve the procedures and ability of materials, to analyze the potential duties and to determine a way which can lower the cost and add to the revenue.

Through Green Audit, one gets a direction as how to improve the condition of environment and there are various factors that have determined the growth of carrying out Green Audit. Some of the incidents like Bhopal Gas Tragedy (Bhopal; 1984), Chernobyl Catastrophe (Ukraine; 1986) and Exxon-Valdez Oil Spill (Alaska; 1989) have cautioned the industries that setting corporate strategies for environmental security elements have no meaning until they are implemented.

Green Audit is assigned to the Criteria 7 of NAAC, National Assessment and Accreditation Council which is a self-governing organization of India that declares the institutions as Grade a, Grade B or Grade C according to the scores assigned at the time of accreditation.

The intention of organizing Green Audit is to upgrade the environment condition in and around the institutes, colleges, companies and other organizations. It is carried out with the aid of performing tasks like waste management, energy saving and others to turn into a better environmentally friendly institute.

8.2 Vermicomposting Plant

Vermicomposting (or vermi-compost) is the product of the composting process using various species of worms, usually red wigglers, white worms, and other earthworms, to create a mixture of decomposing vegetable or food waste, bedding materials, and vermicast.

Vermicast (also called worm castings, worm humus, worm manure, or worm feces) is the end-product of the breakdown of organic matter by earthworms. These castings have been shown to contain reduced levels of contaminants and a higher saturation of nutrients than the organic materials before vermicomposting.

Vermicomposting contains water-soluble nutrients and is an excellent, nutrient-rich organic fertilizer and soil conditioner. It is used in farming and small scale sustainable, organic farming.

8.4 Water conservation – Rain Water Harvesting

The college is situated in a region where in extreme summers; we realize the importance of conservation and best utilization of water resources. We maintain and generate our water resources. The water is used carefully and every attempt is made to reduce the wastage.

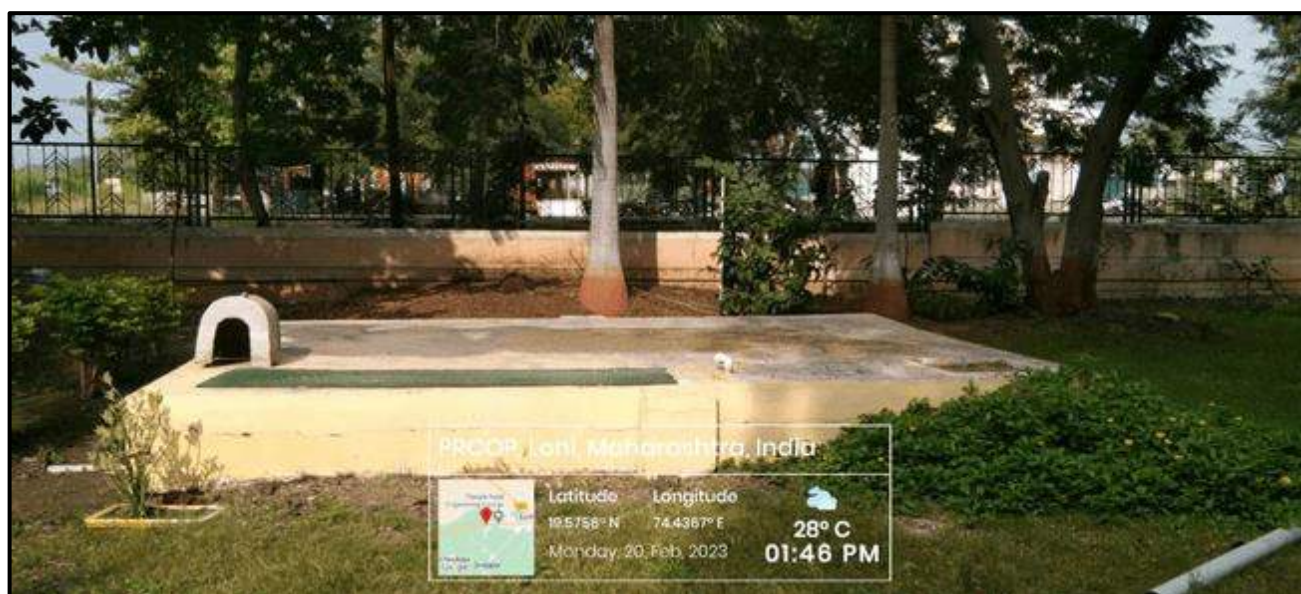
The campus has open wells and bore wells to meet the general needs of the institution.

The water from the top of the roofs and the rain water are collected through proper network of pipes. There is a well-connected pipe network delivery system. This network is instrumental in collecting the water, which is then collected in an underground tank. The network of well-connected pipes carries it to the underground tank specially constructed for this purpose.

Tanks have large capacity. Rainwater harvesting provides an independent water supply during regional water restrictions. The water thus collected is then used for several purposes, mainly like gardening. The institution adopts sprinkler procedure in large lawns and water is very judiciously used for plantation purposes. In the extreme summer season, when water is scarce, the rain water thus collected and stored in the underground tank, is then used for the maintenance of the green cover in the campus.

The rain water, which runs off from the higher surface areas, i.e. in the open field and ground, is restricted in a particular area by building mud ridges surrounding the area, so that the water does not flow away but stands in that area and soaks in the ground. This may help in raising the water table of the area. Thus if the water table rises this may result in more availability of the water in the wells. This also results in avoiding soil erosion.

The students are also encouraged for rain water harvesting and to avoid the wastage of water at campus and at home. For this various lectures and programs are arranged by experts to guide for rain water harvesting and saving water.

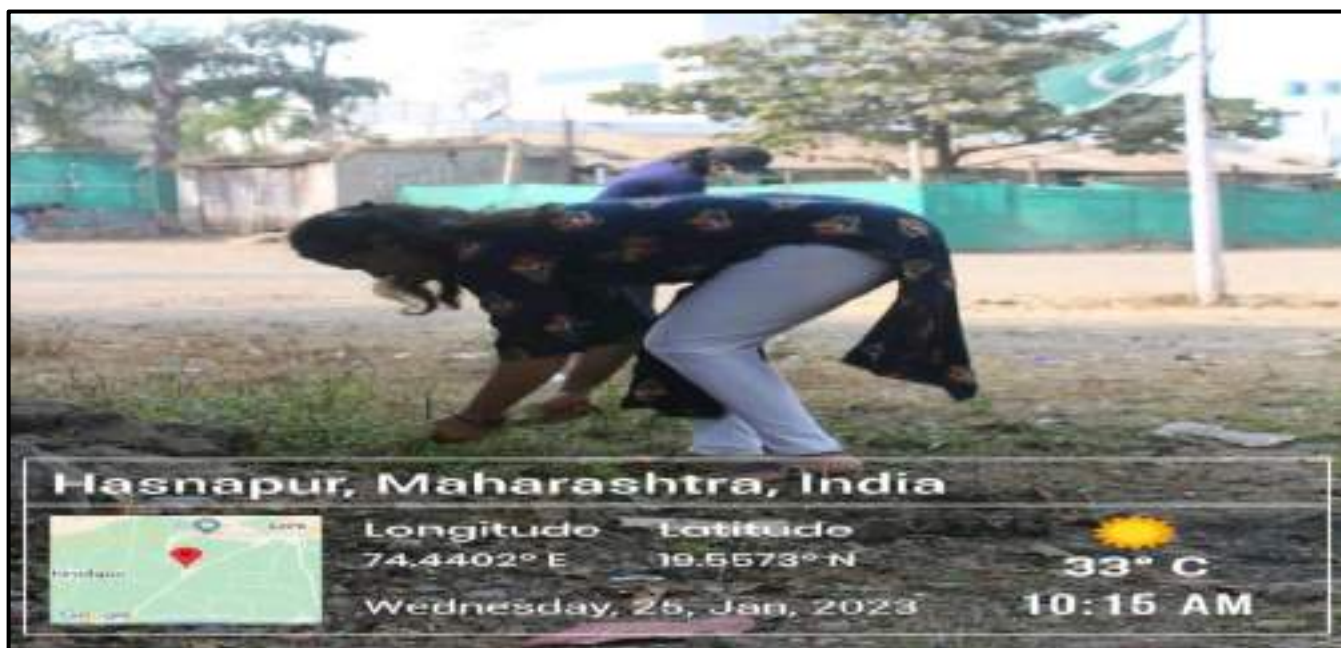



In case of any omission the same should be reported to AICTE immediately.

- The sanction is issued in exercise of the powers delegated to the council and other terms & conditions laid down in the guidelines of the scheme.
- 100% grant of the sanctioned amount is being released to Government/Govt. Aided institutions. Utilization Certificate (UC) and other requisite documents are to be submitted within one month of the completion of the project.
- To self-financed /Pvt. Institutions 80% of the sanctioned amount is being released as second installment followed by 20% as reimbursement after receipt of UC and other requisite documents as specified in terms & Conditions of MODROB-RURAL Scheme.

II. Maintenance of accounts

- The Council or its nominee shall have the right to check/verify the account to satisfy that the fund has been utilized for the purpose for it was sanctioned.
- The date of release of the grant by AICTE shall be taken as the date of commencement of the project. The Principal / Director / Registrar shall intimate about the receipt of the grant to AICTE. Any expenditure incurred prior to the issuance of the approval letter will not be allowed to be adjusted in the grant and if the Institution / University do not take the project work within one month of the receipt of the grant, the approval shall ipso facto lapse.
- After receipt of the grant from AICTE, the Institute shall send a confirmation to AICTE within 2 months of receipt of grant that the sanctioned project has been started/is in progress.

III. Refund of grant by way of a demand draft in favour of Member Secretary, AICTE, New Delhi

- If the college/institute does not have the Letter of Approval (LOA) or Extension of Approval issued by AICTE for the academic year 2019-20, the fund released should be immediately refunded to AICTE with interest accrued thereon.
- If project is not started within six months of the issuance of this Offer Letter, the released amount, along with interest accrued thereon, has to be necessarily returned to AICTE.
- In any case, if the institute is required to refund the grant or interest accrued thereon or balance amount, the amount will be refunded to AICTE.

- d. It may be ensured that the project is completed within the stipulated time. If the project is not completed in time, no further extension will be granted in any case and institute has to refund the entire amount to AICTE.
- e. As AICTE needs adequate time for depositing the Demand Draft in the bank, the same be immediately dispatched to avoid any lapse of the validity period.

IV. Submission of documents by college/institution after completion of Project/Subsequent years.

The following mandatory relevant documents are required to be submitted by the college/institution within one month of the completion of the project:-

- a. Feedback form in the prescribed proforma.
- b. The **Annual Progress Report (APR)** in the prescribed format along with the original Statement of actual Expenditure in the prescribed proforma duly signed by the Head of the institution and shall be submitted to AICTE not later than one month after completion.
- c. The **Utilization Certificate (UC)** supported by Audited Statement of Expenditure to the effect that the grant has been utilized for the purpose for which it has been sanctioned shall be furnished to the AICTE immediately after completion of the project. - f. Project completion report project indicating the activities undertaking, number of students benefited, laboratory works photographs of students, together with their views is to be submitted.
- g. Attested photocopies of supporting vouchers/bills of expenditure incurred for the completion of Project.
- h. Photographs of equipment's purchased.
- i. The balance amount of the grant will be reimbursed to the university/institution only on submission of the above documents. On receipt of these documents, the total amount of balance of financial assistance, admissible as per the norms, shall be worked out and grant-in-aid shall be released, as second installment, in favour of the beneficiary institution.


V. General instructions

- e. The assets acquired wholly or substantially out of grant shall not be disposed or encumbered or utilized for the purpose other than those for which the Grant was given without proper sanction of the AICTE and should at any time the institution cease to function, such assets shall revert to the AICTE.



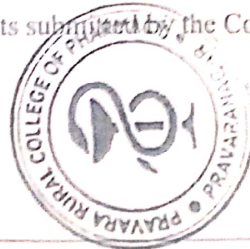


